Learning Outcomes of Elementary Latin

1. Knowledge of the basic forms, grammar, and syntax of the Latin language
2. Ability to read, understand, and translate sentences and passages in Latin
3. Preparation to read original texts and documents in Latin
4. Introduction to the culture and literature of the ancient Romans
5. Appreciation of rhetorical techniques and the expressive power of Latin authors
6. Greater understanding of language in general and English grammar in particular
7. Recognition of the ubiquity of the Latin language in the 21st century

Class Description

Latin 16 is an intensive, 8-week course on Classical Latin, which provides academic credit equivalent to the one-year introductory course in Latin offered by the Department of Classics. The course fulfills the

UCLA language requirement, and the requirements for majors in Classical Civilization. After completing Latin 16, students are equipped to enroll in Latin 20.

Attendance, Participation, and the No Makeup Policy

Due to the unprecedented nature of this Summer Session, this course will be **remote and synchronous**, meaning that we will hold class **live via Zoom** during the scheduled times. The pace of this course demands mandatory attendance at every class. Missing even a single day can have a hugely negative effect on a student's progress. As such, no makeup homework, quizzes, or exams will be accepted, except in cases of documented emergencies. We know that the pace of the class is very intense, so please let us know if you are having problems, and we will try to make arrangements to help you!
